NOTICE OF RACE

The Oakville Yacht Squadron is the Organizing Authority for this series.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing with Sail Canada Prescriptions.
- 1.2 The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice board located on the east wall of the OYS clubhouse.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 Registration is open to any member in good standing of Oakville Yacht Squadron (OYS) or the Oakville Club (OC). Members of other clubs may be accepted at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.
- 2.2 Boats intending to race in a PHRF fleet must have a valid Performance Handicap Racing Fleet-Lake Ontario (PHRF-LO) certificate.
- 2.3 A one-design fleet may be established if four (4) or more boats of the same class are registered to race. All boats registering for a one-design fleet must comply with their class rules.
- 2.4 All entries are at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.
- 2.5 All boats registered in the Spring and/or Fall Series will automatically be registered in the Oakville Challenge Cup (OCC). The NOR and Sis for the OCC will be available on the OYS website.

3 RACE COMMITTEE VOLUNTEERING

- 3.1 All boats are required to volunteer for two (2) race committee duty sessions throughout the year. Failure to meet this requirement will result in disqualification from the boats best series result of the season.
- 3.2 Details of the race committee volunteering process are outlined in Appendix A.

4 FEES

- 4.1 Non-OYS members shall pay \$250.00+HST to register for all scheduled OYS club racing.
- 4.2 OYS members requiring a PHRF-LO certificate shall pay \$40.00 inclusive of HST to obtain a PHRF-LO certificate.

5 SCHEDULE

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 6.1 A sailing instruction supplement will be provided for each series.
- 6.2 The Sailing Instructions will be posted on the Official Notice Board and will be available on the OYS website on the <u>Racing Documents Page</u>. Amendments to the Sailing Instructions and Notices to Competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board.

7 VENUE

7.1 Racing will take place on Lake Ontario with the starting area approximately 1nm south of the Oakville Harbour Lighthouse.

8 COURSES

- 8.1 Courses to be raced will be outlined in the sailing instruction supplements.
- 8.2 Weeknight racing will consist of short courses and races approximately 1 hour long.
- 8.3 Spring and Fall series racing will consist of longer courses and races approximately 3 hours long.

9 SCORING

9.1 Scoring information for each series will be provided in the sailing instruction supplements.

10 PRIZES

11 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

11.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4,

Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or
personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

12 INSURANCE

12.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$2,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

APPENDIX A – RACE COMMITTEE DUTY

The organizing authority recognizes that boats have a limited sailing season and want to make the most out of every day on the water. To ensure our Club Racing program has an ample supply of volunteer Race Committee staff the following requirement is mandated.

- Prior to the season all boats must sign up for two Race Committee Duty sessions.
- A Race Committee Duty session will consist of providing two able bodies for a race. There will be two duty sessions scheduled per race. To satisfy the volunteer requirement a boat could do one of the following two options:
 - Provide four able bodies for one race
 - Provide two able bodies at two races
- Sign up for race committee duty will be on a first come first serve basis. Sign up is done by
 emailing re@oysqn.com with a list of requested slots. A live calendar will be provided on OYS
 website that shows available slots and what boats are signed up for each slot. Boats can
 coordinate with each other if they would like to trade slots. Moving of slots is done by emailing
 rc@oysqn.com.
- A boat is scored as RCD during a race committee duty session. RCD shall be the average of a boats non-excluded scores for a series.
- A boat that misses their scheduled race committee duty session will be scored as DNE in the median race of the series in which they complete the most races.
- Boats that have not signed up for their two duty slots by May 10 will be assigned slots by the race director.
