SAILING INSTRUCTIONS –



2021 TUESDAY PRACTICE DAYS

The intent of this is to provide additional practice on starting and mark rounding. There will be no recorded finishes or scoring of this series

1 RULES

1.1 The events are governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing with Sail Canada Prescriptions.

2 CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

3 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located on the east wall of the OYS clubhouse and in the breezeway. Notices will also be posted on the OYS Website.
- 3.2 On the water, the race committee intends to monitor and communicate with competitors on VHF radio channel 72.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the flagpole on the north end of the OYS lawn.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in Race Signals AP.
- 4.3 When flag L is displayed ashore, a change to the SI's has been posted for review.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 Practice races will start Tuesday July 6th and run Tuesdays to September 14th.
- 5.2 The scheduled time of the first warning signal each day is 18:00.

6 RACING AREA

6.1 The racing area is approximately 1nm south east of the Oakville harbour lighthouse

7 COURSES

- 7.1 There will be 3 starting sequences followed by a short upwind leg, round a mark to port and return to the starting area. DO NOT cross the start line.
- 7.2 After rounding the mark, please keep clear of the boats still sailing to the mark.
- 7.3 Once the fleet has returned to the start area, the second warning signal will be made.
- 7.4 On the 3rd starting sequence boats shall go to a mark further upwind, round to port and return to the start/finish line.

8 MARKS

Marks	Start/Finish	Turning Marks
Description	Orange Tetrahedron	Yellow Tetrahedron

9 THE START

- 9.1 Races will be started using RRS 26 with the warning signal made five (5) minutes before the starting signal.
- 9.2 The starting line is between a staff displaying an orange flag on the signal vessel at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end starting mark.
- 9.3 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area shown in Addendum A during the starting sequence for other classes.
- 9.4 There will be 2 fleets starting 5 minutes apart.
- 10.5 The boats 27 feet and less are start 1 and those over 27 feet will be start number 2.


10 SCORING
