SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Oakville Yacht Squadron (OYS), is the Organizing Authority (OA) for this Regatta.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The series will be governed by the rules as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing with Sail Canada Prescriptions with the following exception.
- 1.2 RRS 44: PENALTY AT THE TIME OF AN INCIDENT The first two sentences of rule 44.1 are changed to: 'A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 or Rule 31 in an incident while racing. However, when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 while in the zone around a mark other than a starting mark, her penalty shall be Two-Turns Penalty.'
- 1.3 All boats shall comply with the rules of the Lake Ontario Performance Handicap Racing Fleet and must hold a currently valid PHRF-LO certificate.
- 1.4 If there is a conflict between the Notice of Race (NOR) and the Sailing Instructions (SI's), the SI's will take precedence.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board at OYS on the east wall of the OYS club house

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any changes in the sailing instructions will be posted on the Sailing Notice Boards before 1200 on the day it will take effect, except that any change in the schedule of races will be posted by 1200 two days before it is to take effect.

4 COMMUNICATION

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the OYS flag pole.
- 4.2 When signalled on-shore, the code flag "AP", Answering Pennant, with two sound signals (one sound when lowered) means the race is postponed. The warning signal for the first start will not be made less than 30 minutes after "AP" is lowered. This changes RRS Race Signals.
- 4.3 Signals made afloat may be made from the committee boat or a mark boat and will be made in accordance with the current Racing Rules of Sailing, on VHF radio channel 72.

6 CLASS FLAGS, DIVISION AND FLEET

- 6.1 A Fleet is all boats participating in a Club Racing series
- 6.2 A Division is a group of boats with a common start.
- 6.3 A Class is a group of boats that are scored together. A Class may have a separate start or may be grouped with one or more other classes within a division.

7 COURSES

The diagram in Addendum A shows the course, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.

8 MARKS

- 8.1 The Start and Finish marks will be orange inflatable tetrahedrons. All other marks will be yellow tetrahedrons. Changed course marks will be green tetrahedrons.
- 8.2 If a mark is missing or adrift, it may be replaced by a boat showing Code Flag 'M" accompanied by a repetitive sound signal.

9 THE START

- 9.1 Races will be starting in accordance with RRS26. A numeral pennant indicating the number of the next division to start will serve as the Warning Signal for that division.
- 9.2 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee Boat and the Start Mark.
- 9.3 Boats whose Preparatory Signal has not been made shall keep clear of the starting line and of all yachts whose Preparatory Signal has been made.
- 9.4 Recall will be signalled in accordance with RRS 29. Additionally, the race committee may broadcast a "boats over early" message on Channel 72. **This is a courtesy which may or may not occur and is not cause for Redress if it does not occur.**
- 9.5 EXCEPTION TO RRS 29.2 GENERAL RECALL. In the event of a general recall, the recalled fleet shall return to the start area, around the end of the start line, and will start after division 4. The start for the next fleet will be in sequence. In the event of more than one general recall, all recalled classes will start in chronological order according to their division number after division 4 starts.
- 9.6 The warning signal will be 1850 hours from May 16 to Aug 8 and 1830 from Aug 15 to Sept 12.

10 CHANGE TO NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

11 THE FINISH

- 11.1 The finish line for a full course will be between the mast bearing the orange flag on the committee boat and the Finish Mark. This changes RRS Race Signals Other Signals.
- 11.2 The finish line for a shortened course shall be in accordance with RRS 32.2

12 TIME LIMIT

- 12.1 The Race Time Limit is official Sunset Time plus 20 minutes.
- 12.2 If no boat has finished within the Race Time Limit, the race is abandoned.
- 12.3 Any boat the has not finished within the Race Time Limit will be scored DNF.

13 PROTEST AND REQUEST FOR REDRESS

- 13.1 Protests shall be filed by completing a protest form available in the OYS race Office.
- 13.2 Written forms shall be left at the OYS race office and an email sent, within the protest time limit, to racingdirector@oysqn.com indicating you've filed a protest
- 13.3 The protest time limit is 12 hours after the Race Committee has returned to the OYS dock.
- 13.4 Notices will be posted no later than 24 hours after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties of or named as witnesses and where the hearings will be held.

14 SCORING

- 14.1 Boats will be scored using the PHRF-LO Primary Time on Time Scoring formula.
- 14.2 See Notice of Race (NOR) for other scoring rules.

15 SAFETY REGULATIONS

15.1 A boat which retires from a race shall inform the Race Committee either directly or by radio (VHF 72) or by relay through another vessel. Failure to do so may result in disqualification from the race in which she had her best previous finish in the series.

16 AUTHORITY, RESPONSIBILITY

- 16.1 All races held as part of the regular racing program are organized under the authority of the OYS Race Committee.
- 16.2 All OYS and OC boats registered to race are required to provide volunteer crew for a Race Committee Duty Session. The Race Committee Volunteer Duty Policy is specified in NOR Addendum A.

17 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

It is the sole responsibility of each yacht to decide whether to start or continue in any race. Competitors participate in the race entirely at their own risk. See RRS Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the race.
